Southern Barossa Lutheran Church Announcements Update from SBLC Call Committee – 15th January 2025.

As reported last week, Nich Kitchen declined our Call. He said that after much thought and prayer, he has decided to decline our call to the Southern Barossa, and to accept the call to Lifeway Church in Sydney. Nick felt he was being led to use his skills in the multi-ethnic mission at Lifeway. Nick stressed that declining our call is not a rejection of our vision and actions. He asked us to be patient as he believes we are heading in the right direction.

Pastor Nich will continue to keep us in his prayers. We ask they you include Nich and his family in your prayers as they make the move to lifeway Church in Sydney.

At the Call Meeting in December, the decision was made to extend a 'contingent' call to Ben Hentschke in the event that Nich declined our call. We contacted Bishop Andrew Brook and confirmed we are extending a call to Ben Hentschke. Ben returned from leave on Monday and Bishop Andrew informed him of our Call. We contacted Ben and have emailed the supplemental information regarding our call to him as the Lead Pastor for the SBLC. Ben also has received a call to Golden Grove. He has 4 weeks to consider and respond to the calls.

We ask that you include Ben and his family in your prayers as they consider the two calls they have received.

Firstly thank you all for the support over the past year and especially the past few months.
